## Biographical Sketch

Sergeant First Class Justin W. Blewitt is a 92R, Parachute Maintenance Technician, serving in the Team's Rigging loft. He has trained with the Competition Team for the last ten years.

SFC Blewitt joined the Army in May of 2004, attended his initial entry training and was then assigned to Fort Benning, GA. In the fall of 2005 he chose to attend the Golden Knight Assessment and Selection Program, which the knights use as a tool to assess a jumpers skydiving learning curve as well as their team working abilities.



Since learning to skydive in 2001 he has done more than 10,000 free fall parachute jumps and 30 military static line jumps.

2014 brought 3 more National Gold and a World Championship Gold from the Czech Republic. In 2015 they earned 2 Gold medals at the U.S. Nationals and another Gold medal at the 2016 World Meet.

His most recent accomplishments include winning 2 Gold medals and setting a new 8-Way World Record at the U.S. National Championships in 2015. Two months later he and his team brought back Gold and broke their own World Record at the 2015 World Air games in Dubai, UAE. In 2016 they won 4 Gold Medals as Overall Competitors at the U.S. Nationals. Finally, they won the Gold Medal in 8 way at the 2018 World Championships in Gold Coast Australia.

During his free time he enjoys hunting, and spending time with family.
