SFC Marcus Denniston, is serving on the Tandem Team as an Tandem Instructor and Videographer.

Denniston enlisted in the Army more than fifteen years ago and attended Basic Training at Fort Jackson, South Carolina. Immediately after he attended Advanced Individual Training as a Petroleum Supply Specialist 92F -at Fort Lee, Virginia and was stationed at K-16 Republic of Korea and then to Fort Lewis, Washington.

He then attended Defense Language Institute at the Presidio of Monterey, California to learn Arabic and went to his second Advanced Individual Training at Goodfellow Air Force Base in San Angelo, Texas to become a 35P Cryptologic Linguist.

He was then stationed at Fort Riley, Kansas where he deployed as a Cryptologic Linguist Supervisor with 2STB, 2HBCT, 1ID to Baghdad, Iraq 2010-2011. Following his deployment he was assigned as an Arabic Military Language Instructor for three years at the Defense Language Institute.

Denniston then went on to serve as a Special Operations Team Alpha Team Sergeant in 3rd Battalion, 3rd Special Forces Group (A) at Fort Bragg, North Carolina until being assigned to the U. S. Army Parachute Team in 2016.
